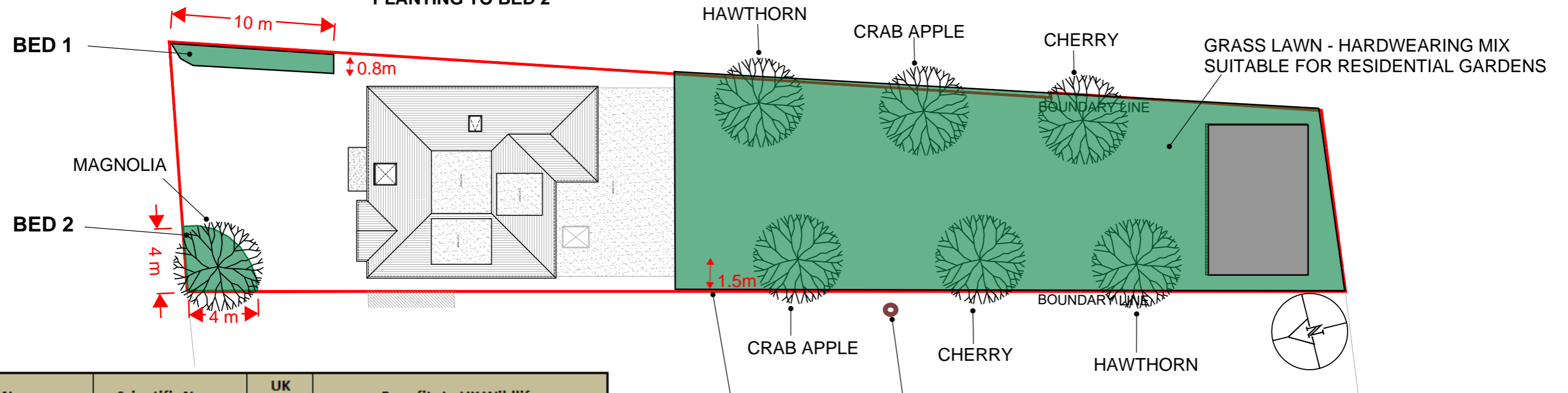

Name	Scientific Name	UK Native	Benefits to UK Wildlife
Wild Cherry	<i>Prunus avium</i>	Yes	Blossom supports pollinators; fruits feed birds and mammals; nesting habitat.
Common Hawthorn	<i>Crataegus monogyna</i>	Yes	Flowers for pollinators; haws for birds; dense thorny shelter and nesting cover.
Crab Apple	<i>Malus sylvestris</i>	Yes	Spring blossom for bees; autumn fruit for birds and mammals; good biodiversity value.

## TREE PLANTING TO REAR GARDEN
