

# BS 5837:2012 TREE RETENTION CATEGORIES

**Category 1**  
Tree to be retained in situ with an estimated remaining life expectancy of at least 20 years.

**Category 2**  
Tree to be retained in situ with an estimated remaining life expectancy of at least 10 years.

**Category 3**  
Tree to be retained in situ with an estimated remaining life expectancy of at least 5 years.

**Category 4**  
Tree to be retained in situ with an estimated remaining life expectancy of at least 2 years.

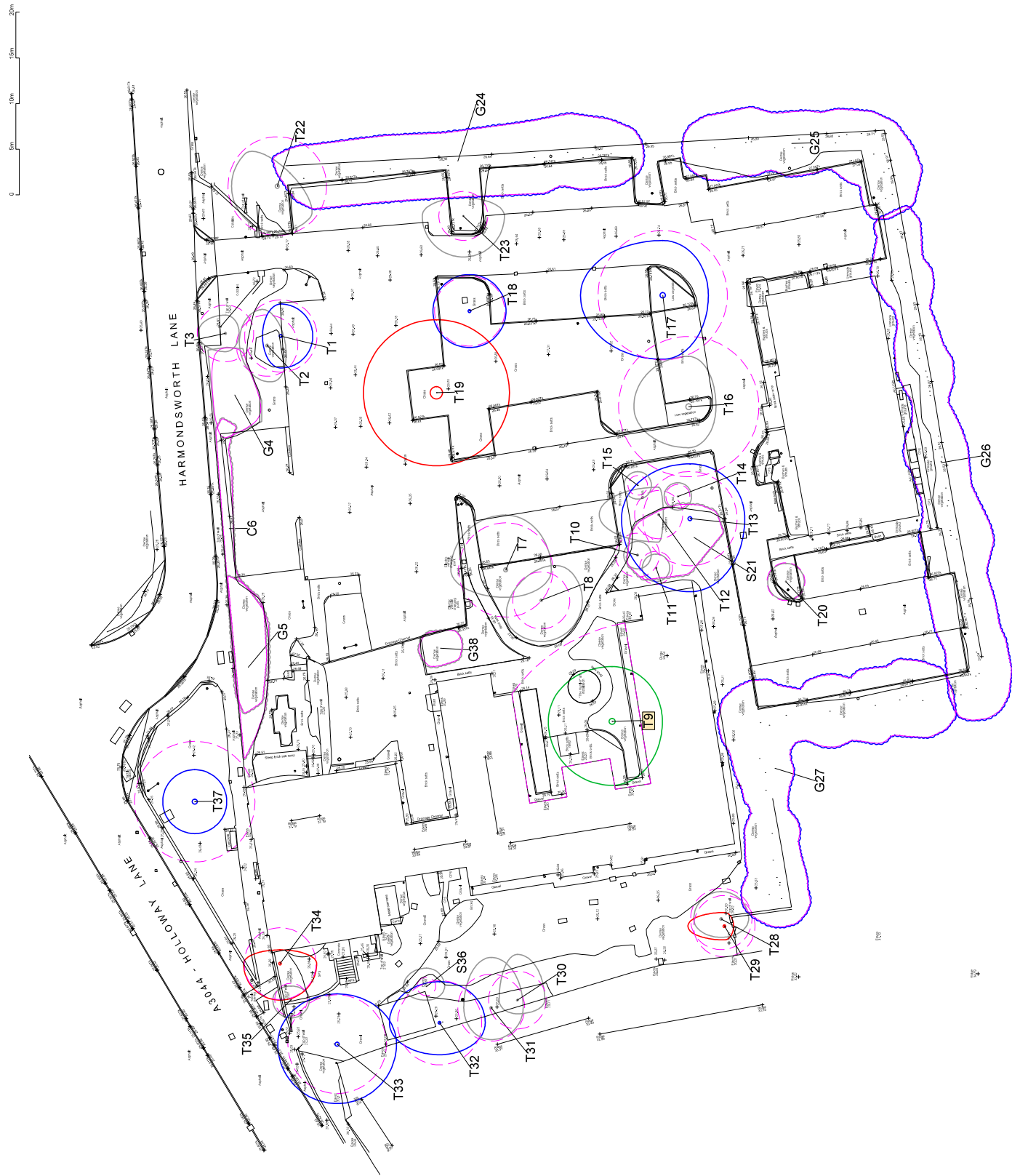
**Category 5**  
Tree to be removed.

**BS 5837:2012 Tree Retention Categories**

The effect of all trees and shrubs on the ground has been assessed, due to the presence of adjacent buildings, roads, etc. (see section 10.1).
