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SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS

- 1 · Notwithstanding the notation 'note subject to final survey' on plan 622 PL 02 C, the development shall not be carried out otherwise than in strict accordance with the plans hereby approved unless consent to any variation is first obtained in writing from the Local Planning Authority.

REASON

To ensure that the external appearance of the development is satisfactory and complies with Policy BE13 and BE25 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan Saved Policies (September 2007).

- 2 · No development shall take place until details and/or samples of all materials, colours and finishes to be used on all external surfaces have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

REASON

To ensure that the development presents a satisfactory appearance in accordance with Policies BE13 and BE25 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan Saved Policies (September 2007).

- 3 · No development shall take place until a landscape scheme providing full details of hard and soft landscaping works has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority and these works shall be carried out as approved. The scheme shall include: -
 - Planting plans (at not less than a scale of 1:100),
 - Written specification of planting and cultivation works to be undertaken,
 - Schedule of plants giving species, plant sizes, and proposed numbers/densities where appropriate,
 - Implementation programme.The scheme shall also include details of the following: -
 - Proposed finishing levels or contours,
 - Means of enclosure,
 - Car parking layouts,
 - Other vehicle and pedestrian access and circulation areas,
 - Hard surfacing materials proposed,
 - Minor artefacts and structures (such as play equipment, furniture, refuse storage, signs, or lighting),
 - Existing and proposed functional services above and below ground (e.g. drainage, power cables or communications equipment, indicating lines, manholes or associated structures),
 - Retained historic landscape features and proposals for their restoration where relevant.

REASON

To ensure that the proposed development will preserve and enhance the visual amenities of the locality in compliance with policy BE38 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan Saved Policies (September 2007).

SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS

- 4 · All hard and soft landscaping shall be carried out in accordance with the approved landscaping scheme and shall be completed within the first planting and seeding seasons following the completion of the development or the occupation of the buildings, whichever is the earlier period.

The new planting and landscape operations should comply with the requirements specified in BS 3936 (1992) 'Nursery Stock, Part 1, Specification for Trees and Shrubs' and in BS 4428 (1989) 'Code of Practice for General Landscape Operations (Excluding Hard Surfaces)'. Thereafter, the areas of hard and soft landscaping shall be permanently retained.

Any tree, shrub or area of turfing or seeding shown on the approved landscaping scheme which within a period of 5 years from the completion of development dies, is removed or in the opinion of the Local Planning Authority becomes seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the same place in the next planting season with another such tree, shrub or area of turfing or seeding of similar size and species unless the Local Planning Authority first gives written consent to any variation.

REASON

To ensure that the landscaped areas are laid out and retained in accordance with the approved plans in order to preserve and enhance the visual amenities of the locality in compliance with policy BE38 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan Saved Policies (September 2007).

- 5 · No development shall take place until a schedule of landscape maintenance for a minimum period of 5 years has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. The scheme shall include details of the arrangements for its implementation. Maintenance shall be carried out in accordance with the approved schedule.

REASON

To ensure that the approved landscaping is properly maintained in accordance with policy BE38 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan (September 2007).

- 6 · No development shall take place until details of the entrances/exits (including fire escapes) have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. the submitted details shall demonstrate:
- a) Appropriate door widths and level access (maximum upstand of 10mm);
 - b) Automation of the principal entrances or that they require only appropriate opening force; and
 - c) marking of glazed entrances and screens for safety and visibility.

Thereafter the development shall be implemented in accordance with the approved details.

REASON

To ensure that the entrances are designed to accommodate the needs of disabled users in accordance with Polcies 4B.5 of the London Plan and the Accessible Hillingdon SPD.

SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS

- 7 · The retail floorspace within the application site shall only be used for the sale of the following non-food goods: building and decorating materials and equipment; DIY and garden products; furniture; floor coverings and related ancillary goods; domestic electrical goods and gas appliances; computers and office supplies and equipment and other products ancillary to these main ranges. The premises shall be used for no other purpose (including any other use in Class A1 of the Town and Country Planning (Use Classes) Order 1987 (or any previous equivalent to that class in any Statutory Instrument revoking or re-enacting that order), unless prior written consent is obtained from the Local Planning Authority.

REASON

To ensure the proposal does not have a detrimental impact on the vitality or viability of local centres or encourage unsustainable vehicular trips in compliance with Policies 2A.8, 3D.1, 3D.2 and 3D.3 of the London Plan and Planning Policy Statement 4: Planning for Sustainable Economic Growth.

- 8 · Prior to development commencing, the applicant shall submit a demolition and construction management plan to the Local Planning Authority for its approval. The plan shall detail:
- (i) The hours during which development works will occur (please refer to informative 5 for maximum permitted working hours).
 - (ii) Traffic management and access arrangements (vehicular and pedestrian) and parking provisions for contractors during the development process (including measures to reduce the numbers of construction vehicles accessing the site during peak hours).
 - (iii) The storage of demolition/construction materials on site.

The approved details shall be implemented and maintained throughout the duration of the demolition and construction process.

REASON

To safeguard the amenity of surrounding areas in accordance with Policy OE1 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan (Saved Policies 2007).

- 9 · No floodlighting or other form of external lighting shall be installed unless it is in accordance with details which have previously been submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Such details shall include location, height, type and direction of light sources and intensity of illumination. Any lighting that is so installed shall not thereafter be altered without the prior consent in writing of the Local Planning Authority other than for routine maintenance which does not change its details.

REASON

To safeguard the amenity of surrounding properties in accordance with policy BE13 of the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan Saved Policies (September 2007) and/or in the interests of highway safety [delete if not relevant] and London Plan (February 2008) Policy 4B.1.

- 1 · The decision to GRANT planning permission has been taken having regard to all relevant planning legislation, regulations, guidance, circulars and Council policies,

- 2 . The decision to GRANT planning permission has been taken having regard to the policies and proposals in the Hillingdon Unitary Development Plan Saved Policies (September 2007) set out below, including Supplementary Planning Guidance, and to all relevant material considerations, including the London Plan (February 2008) and national guidance.

- 3 . You are advised this permission is based on the dimensions provided on the approved drawings as numbered above. The development hereby approved must be constructed precisely in accordance with the approved drawings. Any deviation from these drawings requires the written consent of the Local Planning Authority.

- 4 . You are advised that the scheme is required to comply with either:-

- The Building Regulations 2000 Approved Document Part M 'Access to and use of buildings', or with
- BS 8300:2001 Design of buildings and their approaches to meet the needs of disabled people - Code of practice.
AMD 15617 2005, AMD 15982 2005.

These documents (which are for guidance) set minimum standards to allow residents, workers and visitors, regardless of disability, age or gender, to gain access to and within buildings, and to use their facilities and sanitary conveniences.

You may also be required make provisions to comply with the Disability Discrimination Act 1995. The Act gives disabled people various rights. Under the Act it is unlawful for employers and persons who provide services to members of the public to discriminate against disabled people by treating them less favourably for any reason related to their disability, or by failing to comply with a duty to provide reasonable adjustments. This duty can require the removal or modification of physical features of buildings provided it is reasonable.

- 5 . Nuisance from demolition and construction works is subject to control under The Control of Pollution Act 1974, the Clean Air Acts and other related legislation. In particular, you should ensure that the following are complied with: -

A) Demolition and construction works should only be carried out between the hours of 08.00 hours and 18.00 hours Monday to Friday and between the hours of 08.00 hours and 13.00 hours on Saturday. No works shall be carried out on Sundays, Bank and Public Holidays.

B) All noise generated during such works should be controlled in compliance with British Standard Code of Practice BS 5228: 1984.

C) The elimination of the release of dust or odours that could create a public health nuisance.

D) No bonfires that create dark smoke or nuisance to local residents.

You are advised to consult the Council's Environmental Protection Unit, 3S/02, Civic Centre, High Street, Uxbridge, UB8 1UW (Tel.01895 277401) or to seek prior approval under Section 61 of the Control of Pollution Act if you anticipate any difficulty in carrying out construction other than within the normal working hours set out in (A) above, and by means that would minimise disturbance to adjoining premises.
