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## Oak tree (Quercus Robur TPO 297) 165 Park Avenue , Ruislip, HA4 7UN

After inspecting the large Oak tree , I have concluded that the overhang is significantly close to the fence & house. This poses a threat overtime as more growth continues on the tree it will cause immense strain on the side of the owners fence and possibly falling and destroying anything in the vicinity. Additionally the limbs that are overhanging their house and drive are exposed which can cause the limb to be susceptible to fungus, pests & insects and other common Oak disease's .

In the pictures attached below there is also strong ivy growth located on a lot of the limbs , these are very invasive and put strain on the branches to make them unbalanced for the tree. Pruning back the limbs that are overhanging which are exposed , dying or have ivy growth , back to healthy growth points would be best.

It also has multiple unions growing out of the Oak tree which can cause one to become unbalanced and snap. This makes the Oak tree unbalanced for the neighbours .

I did also see upon inspection some brown/ yellow leaves indicating that there is a problem with the Oak such as ( Bacterial leaf scorch ) could be a multitude of factors like fungus pests & insects, exposed wounds etc.

I believe the Owner doesn't intend to prune the (TPO 297 Oak tree ) therefore the neighbours who live at this address want to be able to prune what is overhanging there drive and house. As it does have a TPO I would report it to your local Authority and go from there.
