e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Common Ash (T10) on TPO384 - crown reduction due to becoming leggy, low hanging branches are resting on an outhouse building and large number of dead branches break off and fall to the ground below making the area unsafe for my children to play. The main stem also has a major branch spanning over the immediate neighbours property causing similar issues.

We have consulted Barritt Tree Specialist who have suggested a 20 to 30% crown reduction and to remove all dead branches which are at risk of falling. The crown reduction will also reduce extended branches over neighbouring properties.
