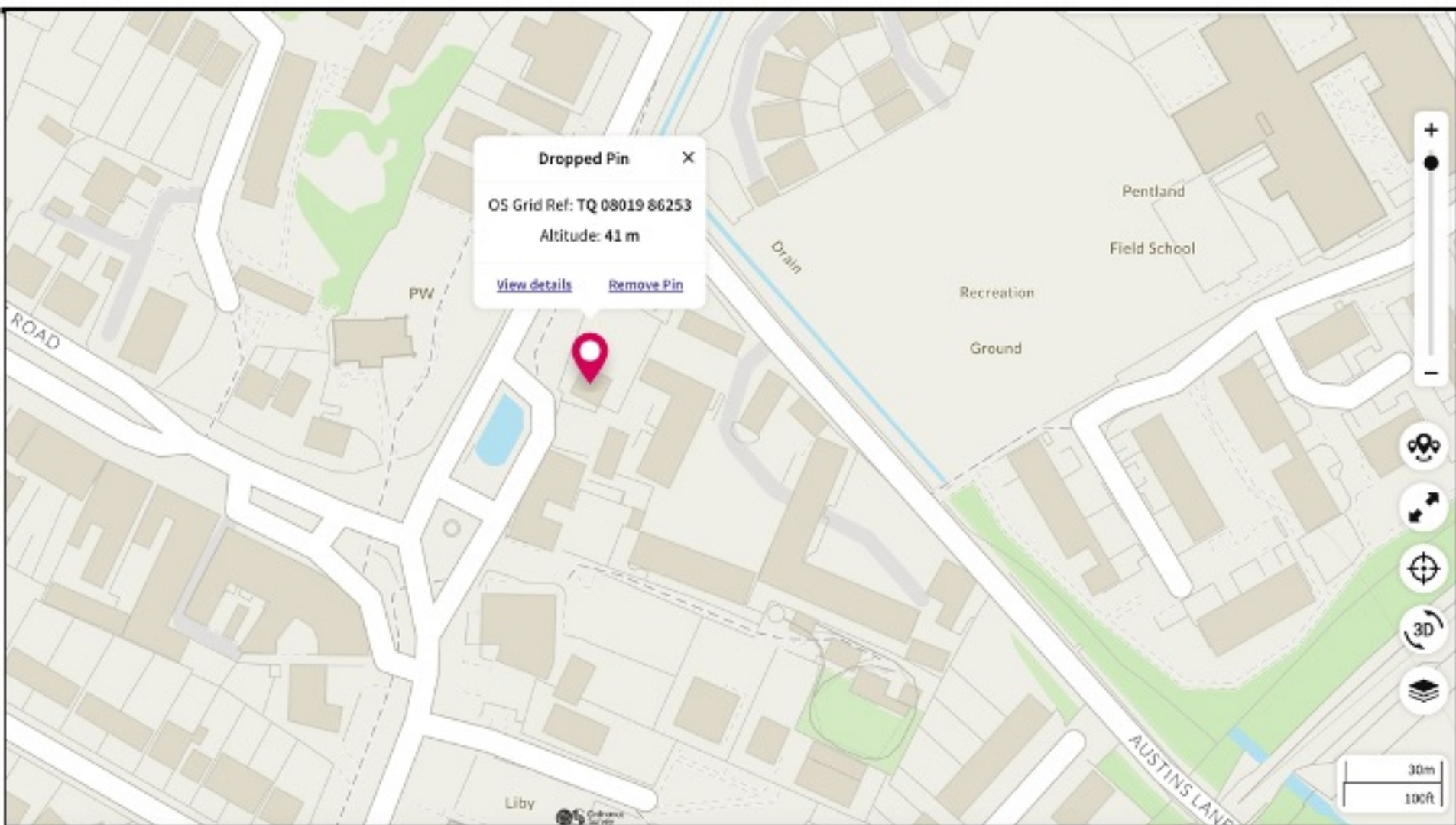
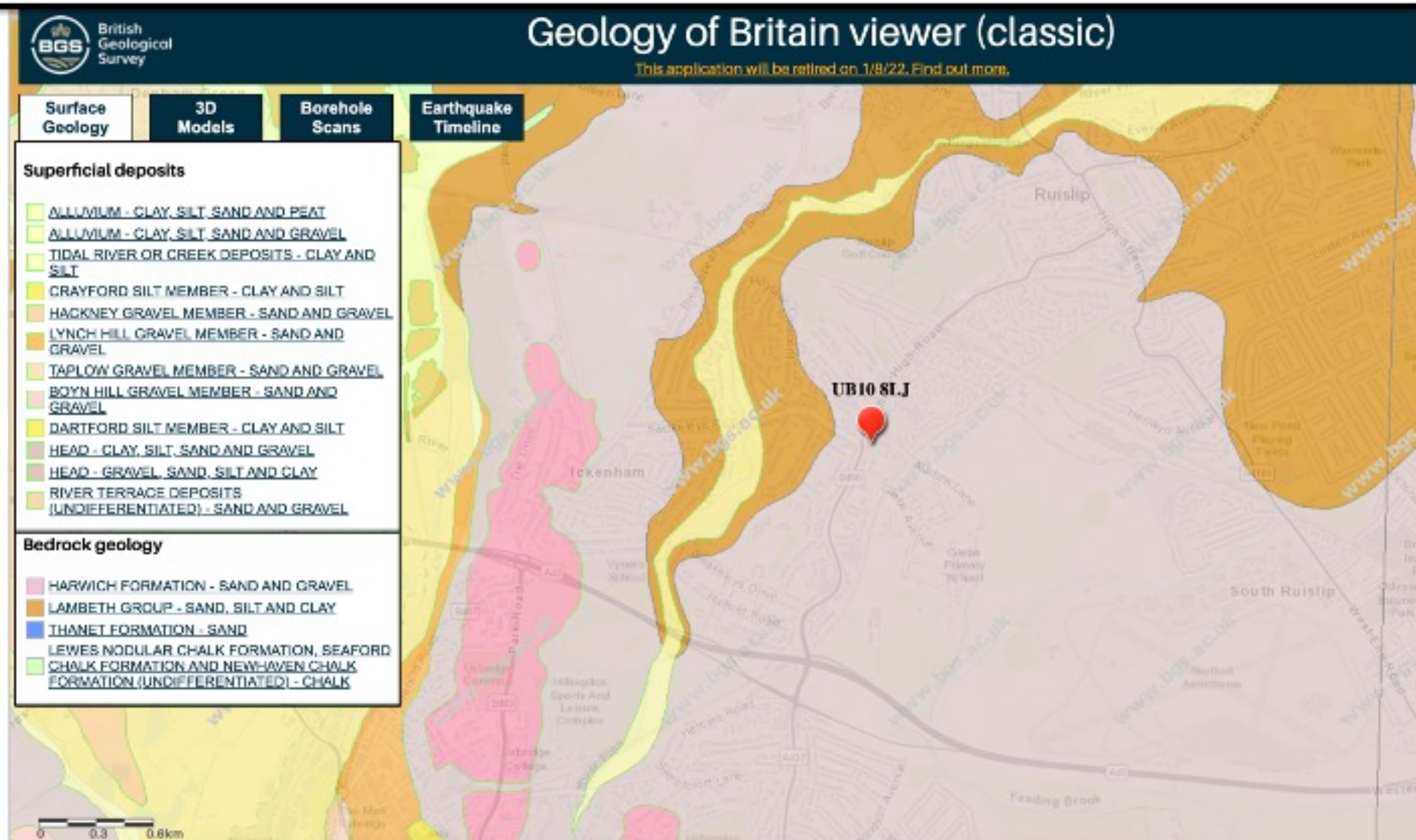


Figure 2 Site Location Map (Source: Google Maps)

Figure 4 Environment Agency's Flood Map

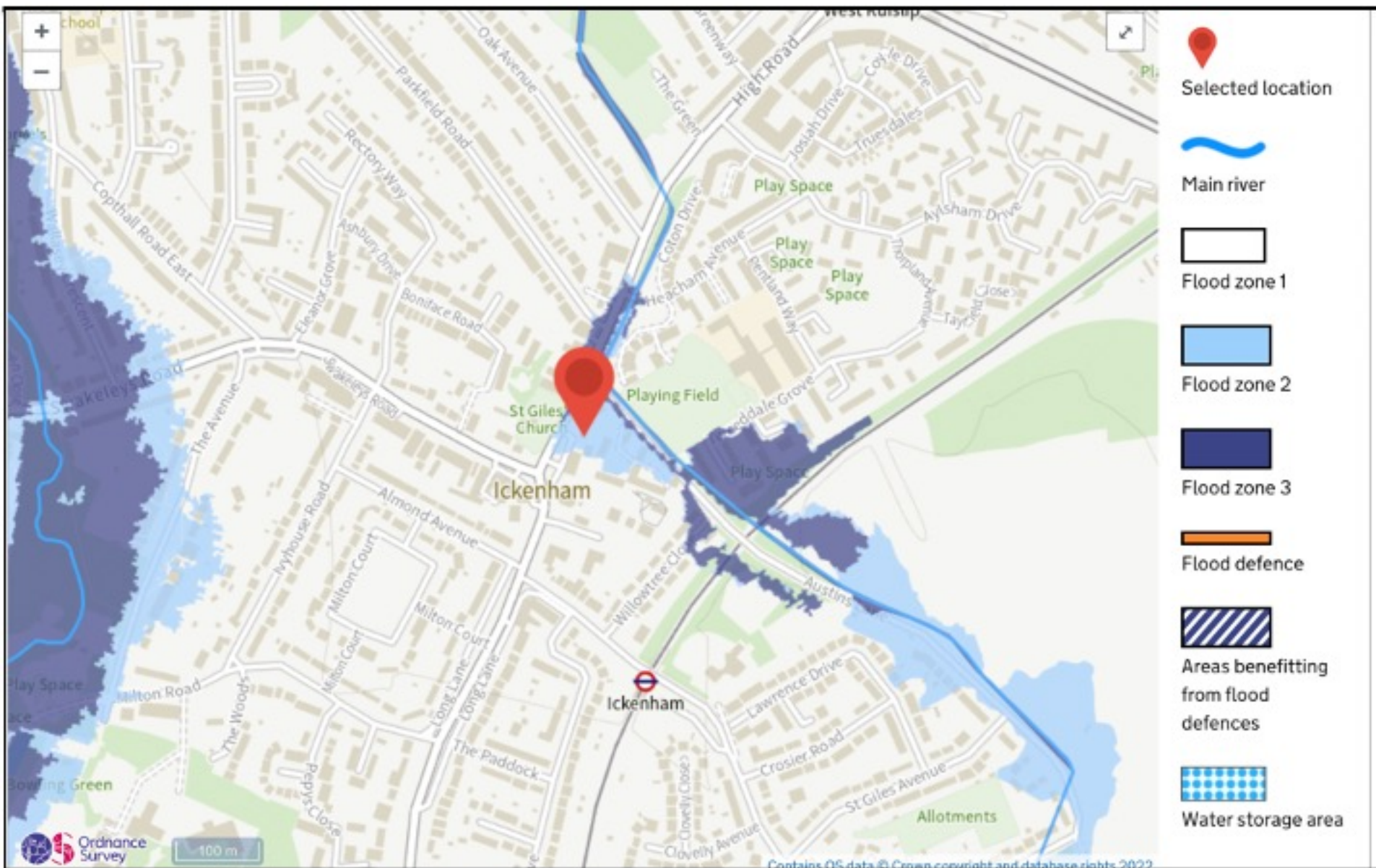


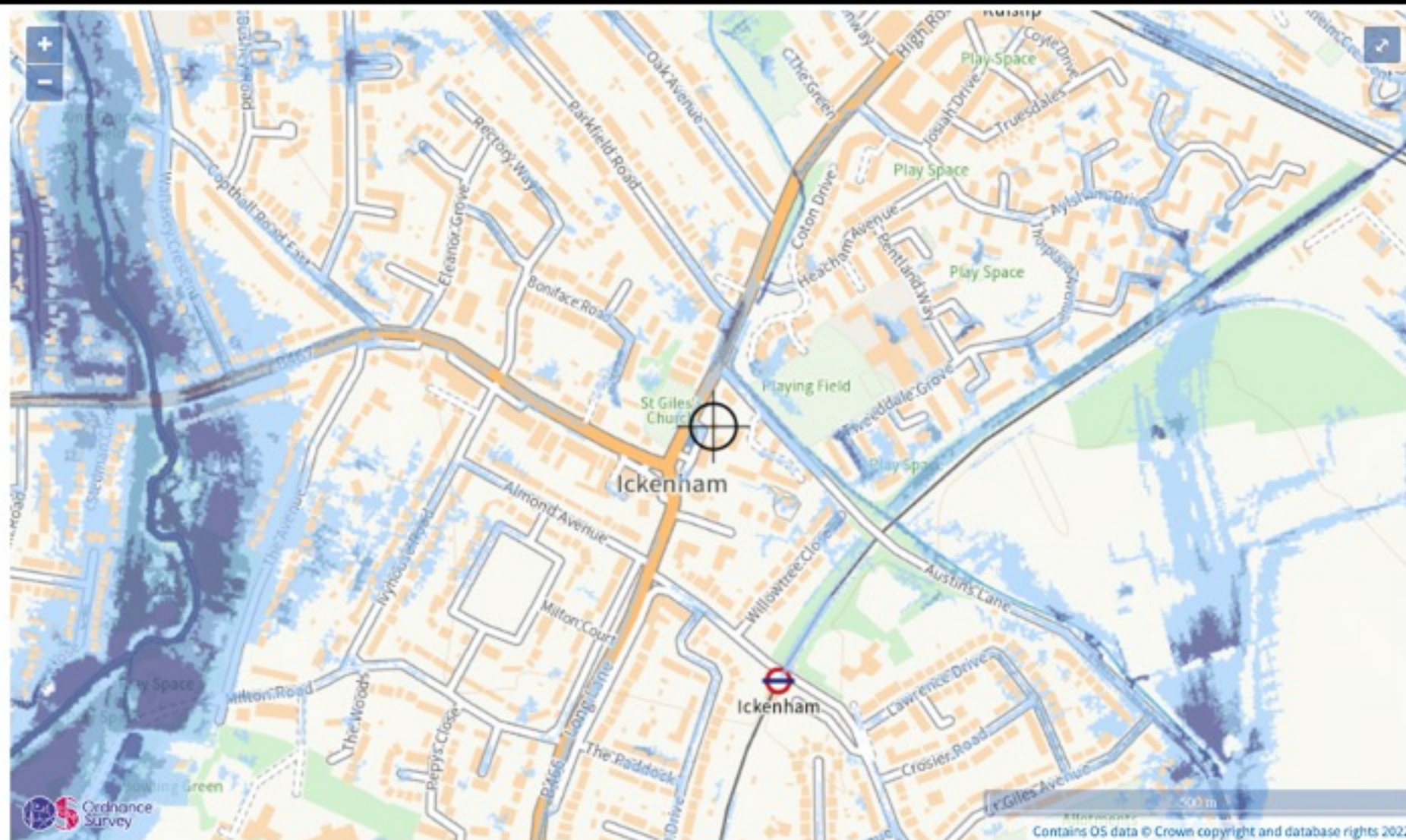
Figure 5 Environment Agency's Flood Risk Map

Figure 6 Environment Agency's Surface Water Flood Risk Map



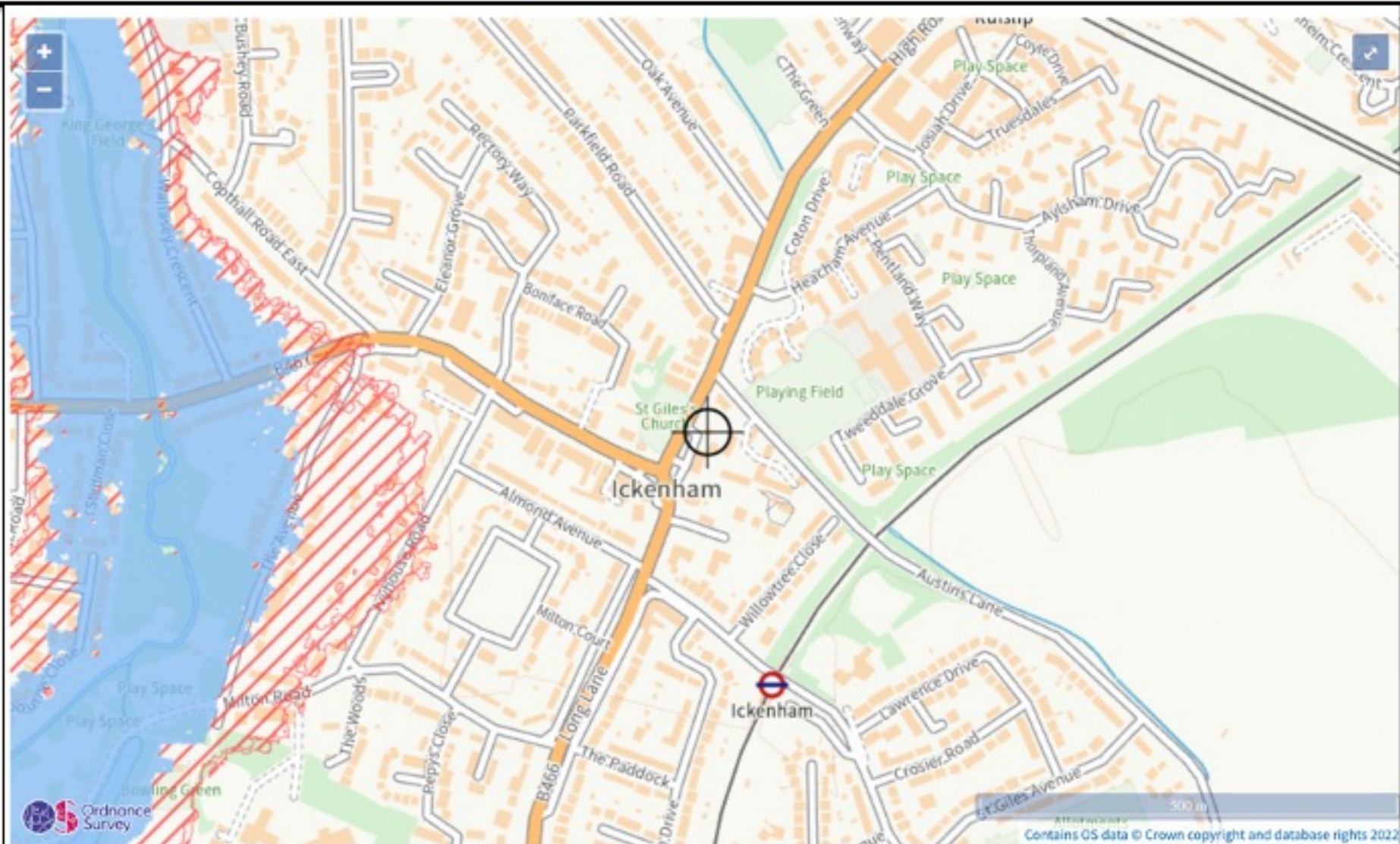
