

**10 Tanworth Close
HA6 2GF
Leyland Cypress Removal Argument**

The two trees within this small garden are part of a row of trees running all down the rear boundary line. These are common Leyland Cypress and were planted as a hedge that are now overgrown. This hedge has been largely unmanned and has not been managed for many years resulting in excessive overgrowth with branches falling.

6, 5 and 4 Tanworth Close have had their Leyland Cypress removed

Majority of the back garden faces back to the car park.

Regrowth has been huge with all top sections vulnerable to wind damage. Sideways growth has also been huge with many overlong side branches very prone to collapse especially from wind or snow damage. Many sections appear to have already failed and more likely to follow.

These trees have become so overgrown that I do not believe any pruning will leave a safe or valuable asset to this location. Sideways growth is so overgrown that it needs to be cut back beyond the foliage on the ends of the branches, and by doing this all screening is lost, and no regeneration can be expected. The arboriculturist report seems to support this assessment.

Our objective is to remove both trees from rear garden location by dismantling in sections and into available space. Stumps to be cut as low as location allows.
