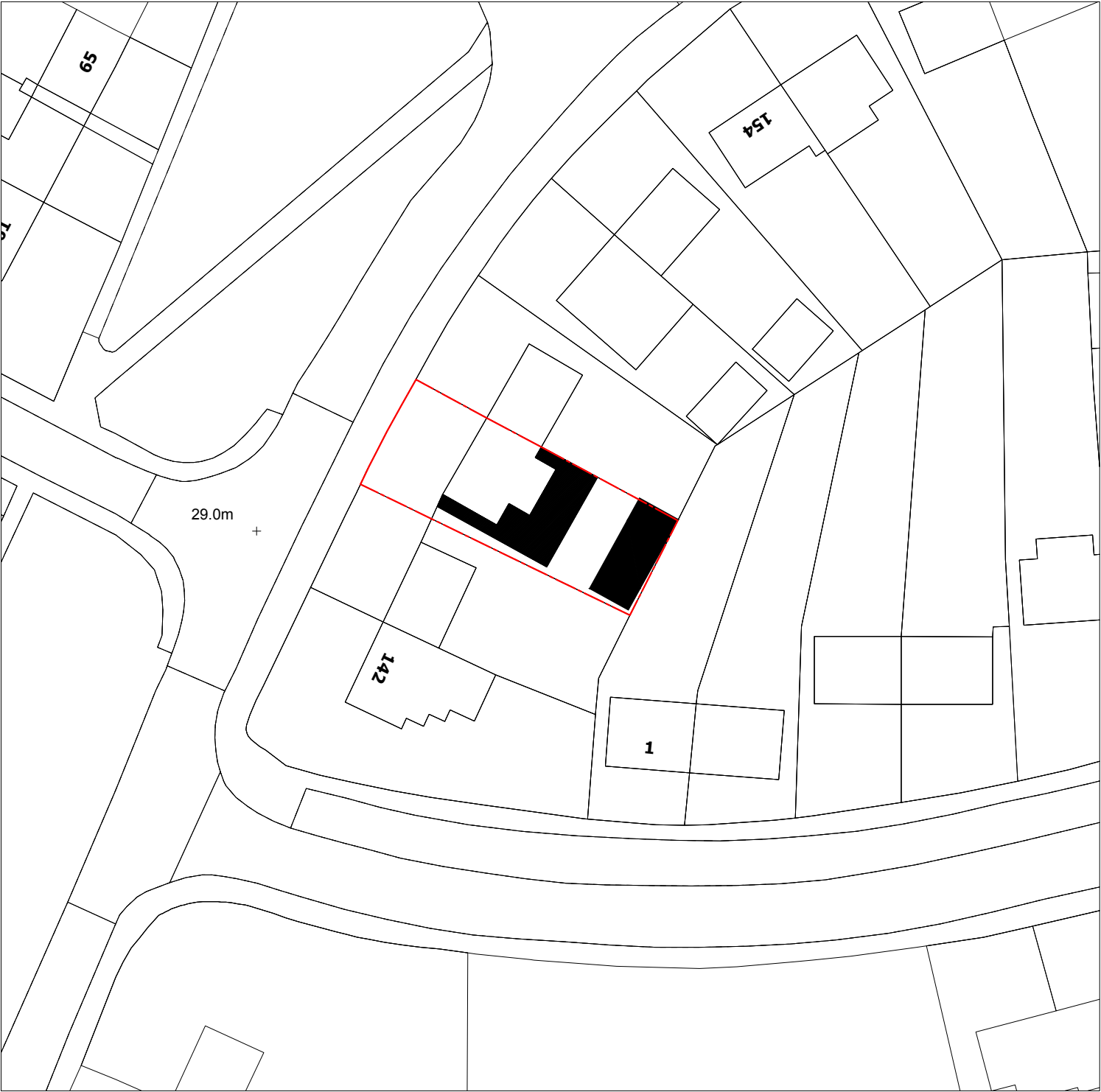

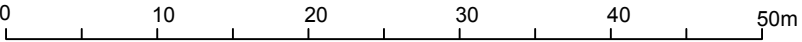

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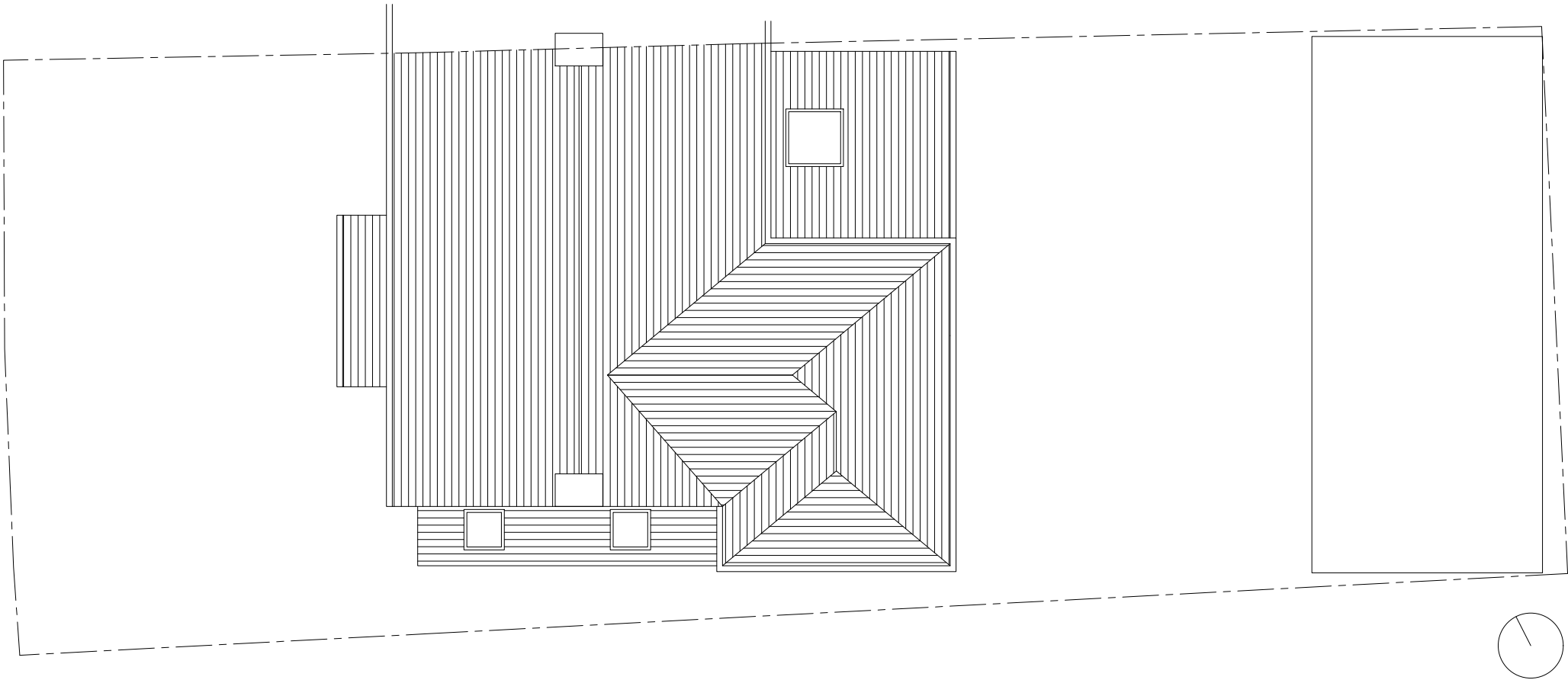

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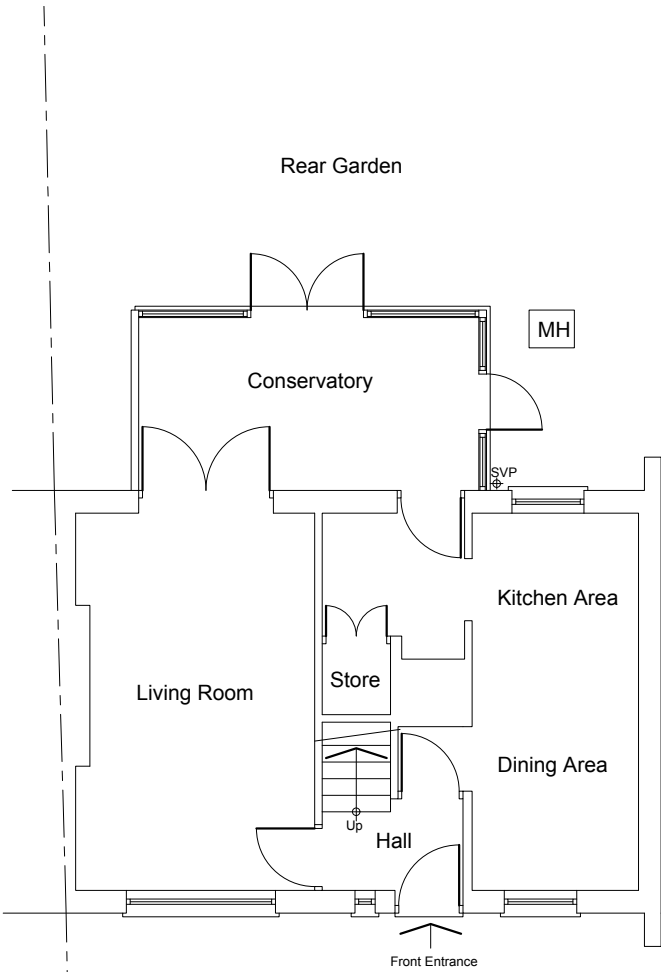

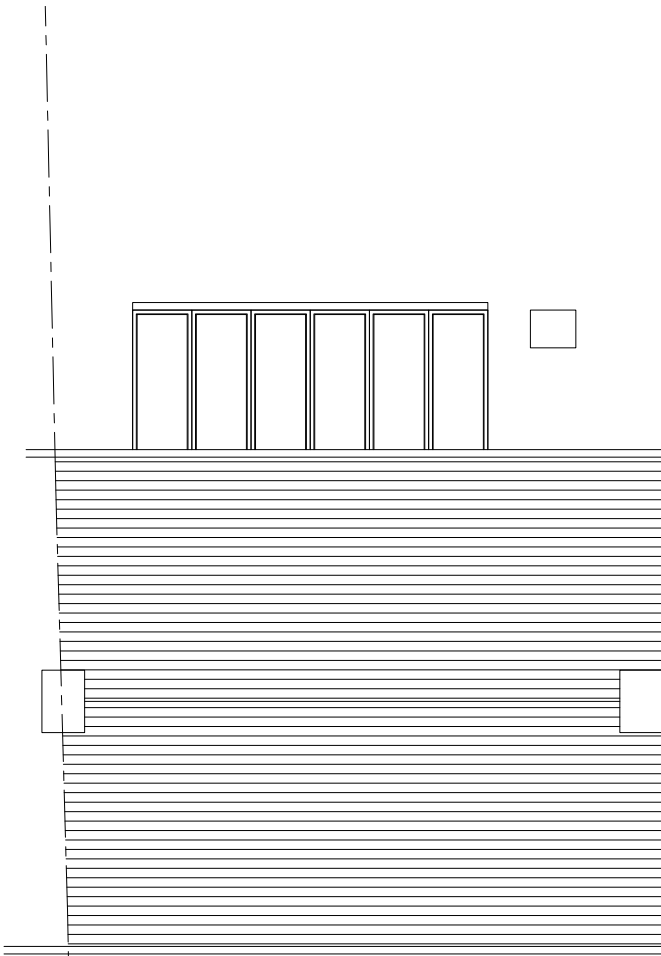
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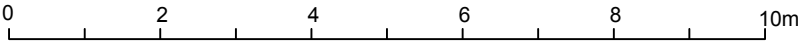
Existing Ground Floor Plan

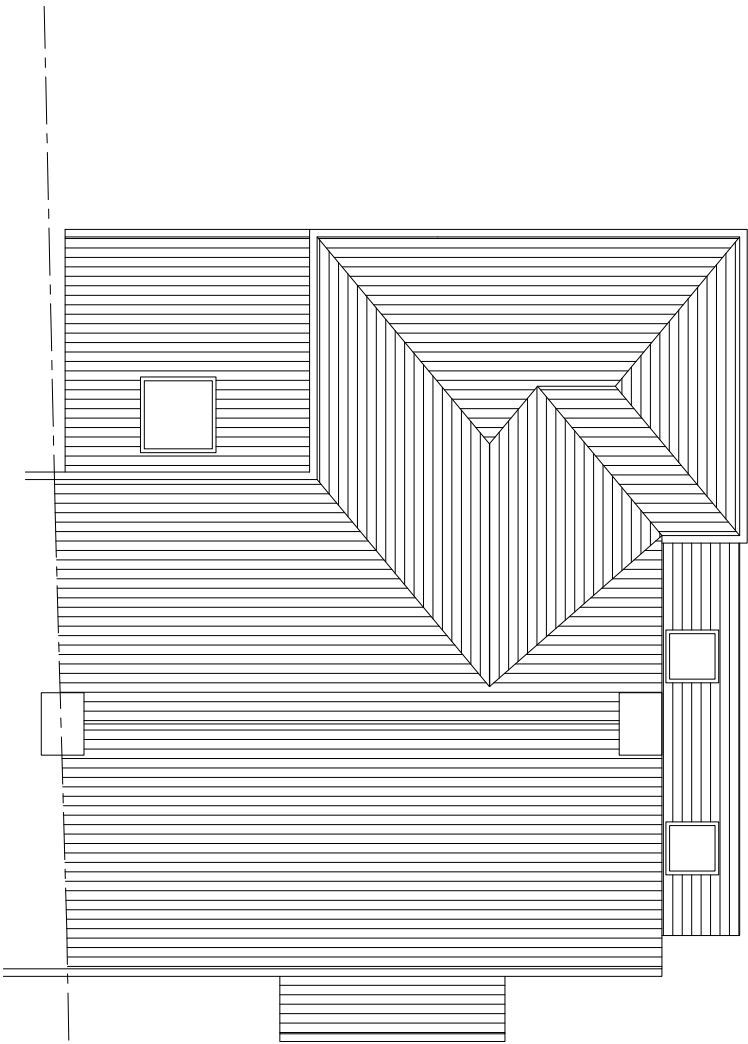

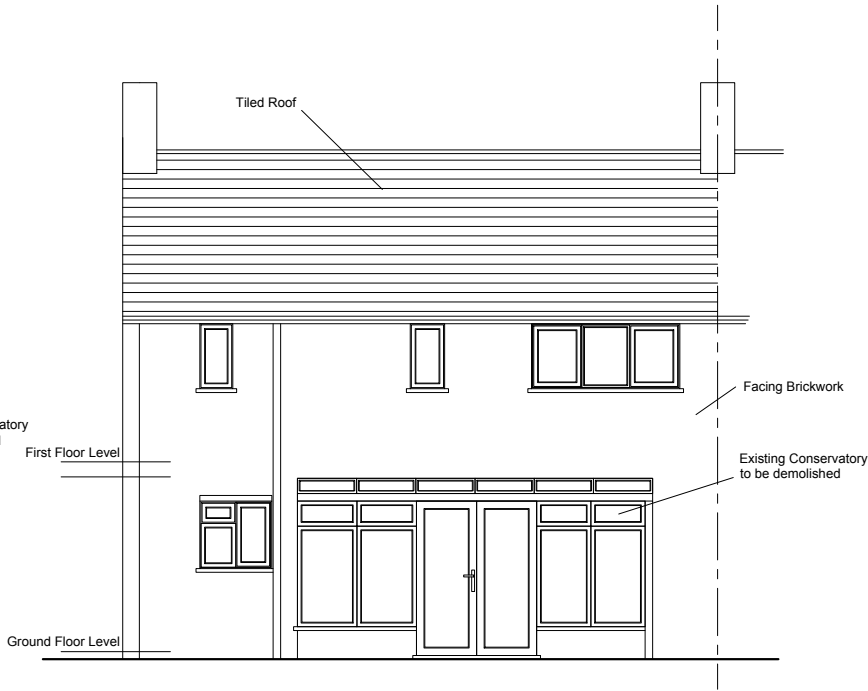

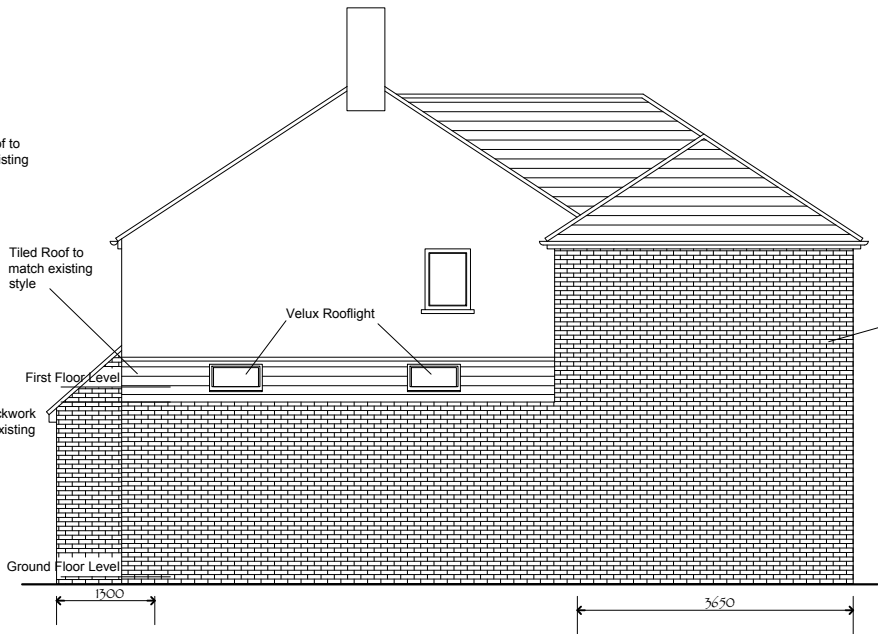
Existing Side Elevation

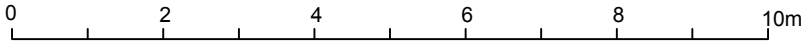

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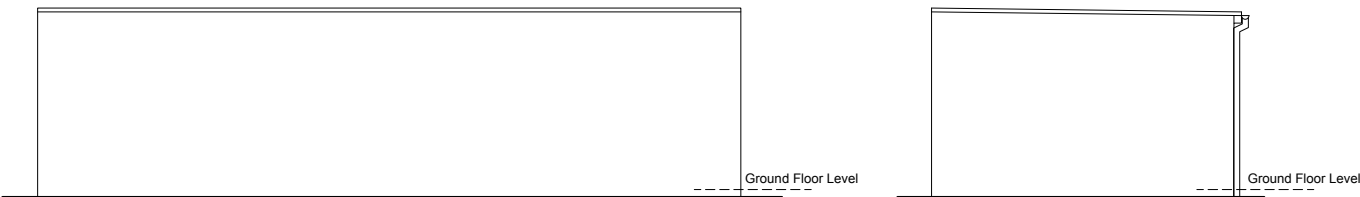

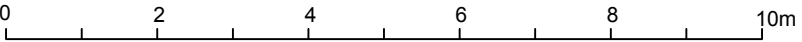

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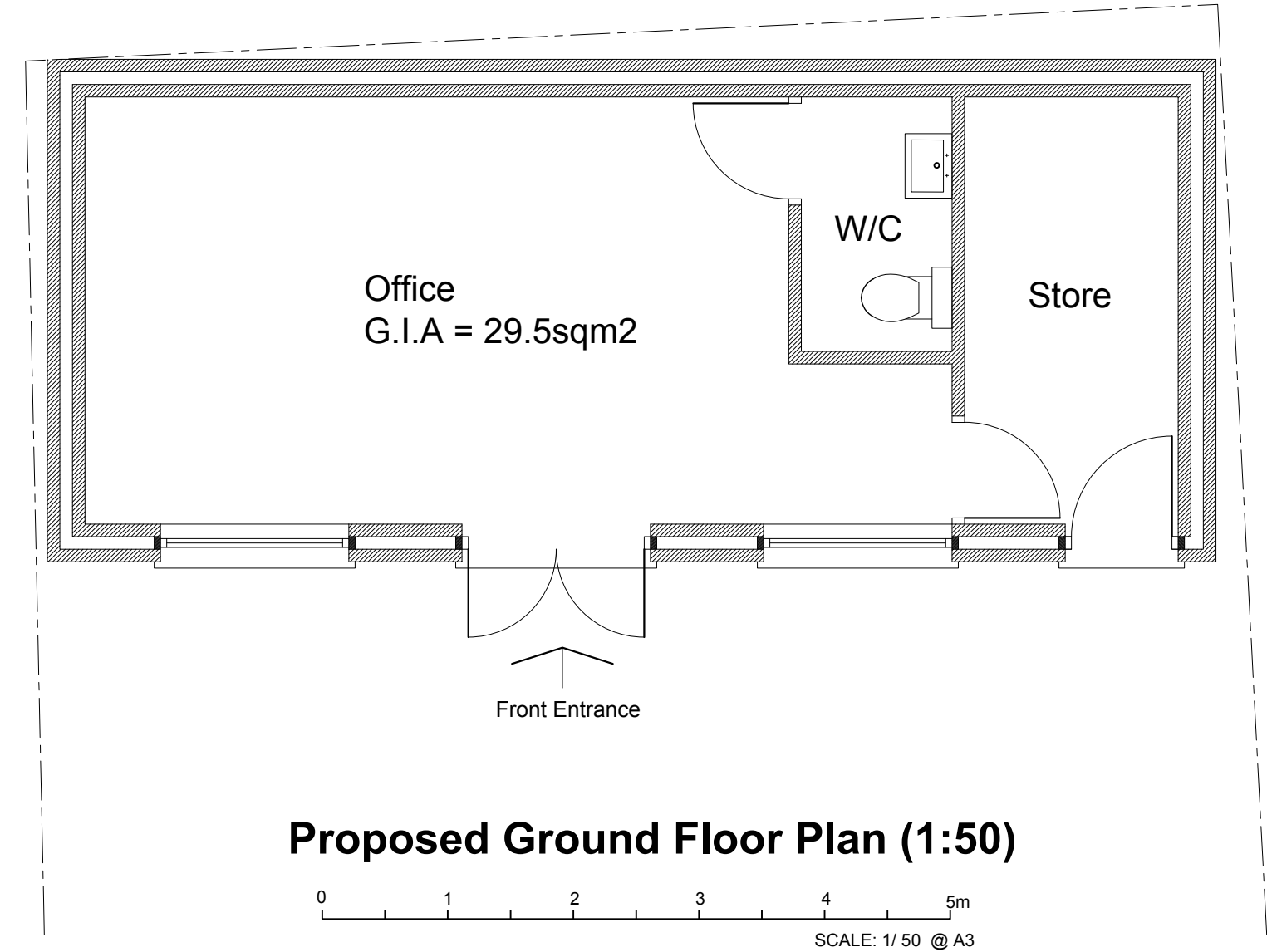

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Proposed Ground Floor Plan (1:50)



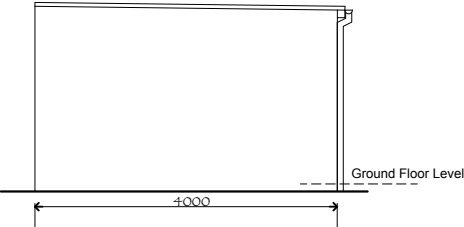
Proposed Front Elevation (1:100)



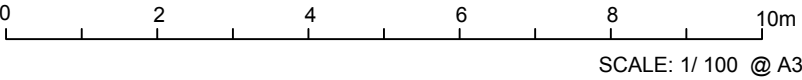
