Details of the pre-application advice received



The Council's follow-up pre-application response acknowledged that there is scope to extend the property beyond its existing form and considered the overall revised scheme to represent an improvement over previous proposals.

The Council further advised that only minor adjustments would be required to make a subsequent formal planning submission more favourable.

The Local Planning Authority confirmed through the follow-up pre-application advice that the principle of a first-floor side extension is considered acceptable.

In direct response to this advice, the proposed first-floor side extension has been set in from the side boundary, increasing the physical and visual separation between the proposed first-floor accommodation and the neighbouring property.

This amendment reduces the perceived mass and dominance of the extension when viewed from the neighbouring property and provides a more comfortable relationship between the two dwellings.

The setback also provides greater articulation to the side elevation, visually breaking up the previously proposed expanse of elevation and ensuring that the extension reads as a subordinate and carefully considered addition to the original dwelling

The proposed development includes a carefully considered increase to the existing ridge height to facilitate the successful conversion and use of the roof space.

During the follow-up pre-application process, the Local Planning Authority noted the proposed increase in ridge height and requested that its relationship with the surrounding properties be appropriately demonstrated.

The application is therefore supported by contextual information illustrating the proposed ridge height in relation to the surrounding street scene and neighbouring dwellings.

The application property is positioned further back from the street than adjacent properties. This setback assists in reducing the prominence of the proposed roof alteration when viewed from public vantage points along Boundary Road.

The proposal includes a replacement roof to the existing single-storey rear extension.

The proposed parapet flat-roof form provides a simple and contemporary architectural treatment that remains subordinate to the main two-storey dwelling.

The simple roof profile limits unnecessary visual bulk and provides a clean transition between the existing dwelling and rear garden.

Given its position to the rear of the property, the proposal would have limited visibility within the wider public street scene.

The proposed front porch is modest in scale and has been designed to complement the proportions and architectural appearance of the existing dwelling.

The property is set back from the street relative to neighbouring properties, which further reduces the visual prominence of the proposed porch within the street scene.
